Regular attendance at a dental practice is one of the best ways to maintain good oral health. Some people have found this difficult to do, particularly if they have not been seen at a local practice in recent years.

The Dental Access Service (DAS) helps people access a dental practice on a continuing care basis, with a focus on the following groups:

- Looked-after children
- Families of Armed Forces personnel
- Asylum seekers and refugees
- Those with clinical/medical needs that require attendance at a dental practice
- Patients needing dental check-ups in support of hospital treatment
- Homeless patients
- Pregnant and nursing mothers
- Residents of care homes with identified treatment needs who are able to attend the dental practice for treatment
- Patients with a learning disability
